Cecilia Flaherty—NYC Dept. of Health: Bureau of Correctional Health Services

Correctional Health Services is a Bureau within the Health Care Access and Improvement Division in NYC's Department of Health. CHS is responsible for medical, mental health, dental, discharge planning, and transitional health care services in the City's correctional facilities, which have over 100,000 admissions per year and house roughly 13,500 inmates and detainees on a given day. These services are provided directly and through contracts monitored by CHS.

Jazz Hayden—The Campaign to End the New Jim Crow

The Campaign to End the New Jim Crow is rooted in the awareness that every human being has value and dignity and is entitled to basic civil and human rights, including the right to vote, work, shelter, education, health care and the right to food. With 2.3 million people behind bars, they raise awareness around issues of mass incarceration, while also addressing drug policies, law enforcement practices, prosecutorial (in)descretion, alternatives to incarceration, post-prison reintegration, and changing public attitudes.
